Volunteer with our dedicated Gardens Team - do you enjoy keeping active, finding out about the conservation of our grounds, it's wildlife and learning some new gardening skills? Our gardens department is focused on environmentally conscious gardening, striving to minimise our impact on local biodiversity, whilst maintaining our gardens to a high standard for the enjoyment of our visitors. This volunteer role is based mainly at Anne Hathaway's Cottage but can include sessions at any of our Shakespeare sites.

What will you be doing?

- Supporting the wider Gardens Team and helping them with day-to-day tasks at the properties. Typical seasonal tasks include assisting with planting, pruning, deadheading and weeding.
- There are many activities available to get involved with throughout the year; from willow weaving to apple picking.
- Engaging in conversation with visitors about our gardens and sites
- Being responsible for looking after the tools and equipment that you will be trained to use and cleaning/disinfecting them as appropriate
- You will be volunteering as part of the team of gardeners and volunteers, but you may occasionally be helping other departments
- Work within general Health & Safety policies and procedures

Do you have the skills we are looking for?

- Good people skills with the ability to talk confidently to both individuals & groups
- Previous practical gardening skills would be a bonus, but training will be provided
- A passionate team member, who can also carry out tasks independently to help with garden maintenance and conservation work
- Ability to follow instructions well
- Ability to carry out physical work and be prepared to work outdoors in all weather conditions
